#### I. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. Those present were Hearing Officer Sam Starritt, City Attorney John Shaver and Deputy City Clerk Janet Harrell.

Add Bergman Field as Related Facility – 905 Mesa Avenue, Grand Jct., CO 81501

Sodexo General Manager Joseph Winegardner and Colorado Mesa University Co-Athletic Director/Senior Women Administrator Kristin Mort answered questions about the service of alcohol in the proposed related facility.

The application to add a related facility to the campus liquor complex license was found to be in order and approved.

City of Grand Junction Parks and Recreation Supervisor Emily Krause answered a series of questions regarding the event location, security, and how it will be conducted lawfully.

Hearing Officer Starritt asked if anyone present was in opposition of this special event permit being issued. There was no one. Hearing Officer Starritt entered Exhibits "A" and "B" (attached) into the record.

Hearing Officer Starritt found that pursuant to Colorado State Statute 44-5-106, there are no grounds to deny the special event permit; it would not be injurious to the public welfare because of the nature of the special event, its location within the community, or the failure of the applicant in a past special event to conduct the event in compliance with applicable laws. Hearing Officer Starritt agreed with the City's findings and signed the Stipulation, Agreement and Order for Pete's House of Spirits.

The meeting adjourned at 2:54 p.m.



The event is held in Lincoln Park, south of the Lincoln Park Barn and west of the Lincoln Park Pool.
6. What type of and how many security will be provided at this event and how will they be identified?
Parks and Recreation staff (18 - 24 depending on time) and hired Citadel Security Officers (4 officers).
7. What is the Control Plan for security at this event? (Use additional sheet if necessary)
The beer area will be completely fenced with 3 entrances. At each entrance a Citadel Security Officer
or Parks and Recreation staff will be stationed. All of the other hired Citadel staff will be inside of the
beer area looking for over serving and monitoring the participants.
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8. How will security personnel be identified?
All security will have on a Citadel staff uniform.
9. If this event is being held outdoors, how will the exterior boundaries of the premises be marked (i.e., roped, fenced, etc.)?
Portable fencing provided by FCI. Gates will be staffed by event personnel and security personnel.
Signs will be posted for control of alcohol limits.

10. What method will be used in checking identification for proper age of attendees (i.e., at the door, at the bar, etc.) and how will underage patrons be identified so as not to be served alcohol beverages (i.e., stamp or mark on the hand, etc.)
Drivers licenses or other acceptable photo ID wil be required and checked by trained staff. Wristbands will
be used to verify that patrons have been checked and are able to be served.
11. How will the conduct and level of intoxication of attendees be monitored and by whom?
City and security staff will be monitoring behavior and watching for signs and symptoms as they have
been trained.
12. Have the volunteers or members of your organization been trained in the sale/service of alcohol beverages?
Yes, they have been certified by the State of Colorado.

Mac & Cheese contest, concessions type food, soft drinks and water.
