SSH TRS M, LLC and IH WL Acquisition Manager, LLC filed applications with the Local Licensing Authority on February 9, 2018 for new Lodging and Entertainment liquor licenses permitting sales of malt, vinous and spirituous liquors for sale by the drink at place where sold at 765 and 767 Horizon Drive under the trade names of Courtyard Marriott Grand Junction and Residence Inn Grand Junction respectively. The applications and supplementary documents were reviewed, found to be in order and accepted. Copies were sent to the State Liquor Enforcement Division for a Concurrent Review. The hearing date has been scheduled for April 4, 2018. A "Notice of Hearing" was given by posting signs on the properties on or before noon on March 21, 2018 and by publishing a display ad in the Daily Sentinel on March 21, 2018.

In order to address the reasonable requirements of the neighborhood and the desires of the adult inhabitants, the managers of each property conducted a modified survey. The neighborhood was defined as the area bounded by Yucatan Court on the north, Courtland Avenue on the south, 28 Road on the east, and 26  $\frac{1}{2}$  Road on the west, and includes both side of the streets as the outer boundaries. 




